What we have done so far

- Installed 200kW solar power generation system.
- Installed water tanks for use on gardens and toilet flushing.
- Majority of the site lighting has been changed to LED this is continuing.
- Planted hundreds of native trees and shrubbery around the site.
- Site recycling and waste removal is contracted to Veolia, who convert waste to energy.

What we will do in the future

- Install solar power systems sufficient to produce as much power as required to service the site.
- Install water tanks sufficient to collect enough water to service all site toilet, garden and dust suppression requirements.
